## **OUR DRIVING QUESTION:**

AS WRITERS we are exploring the world of Shakespeare. We will be introduced to a biography of Shakespeare and then we will become familiar with the play 'A Midsummer Night's Dream.'

**AS COMPUTER SCIENTISTS** we will be using Scratch to do some programming. Scratch is available for most devices and can be downloaded for free.

AS CITIZENS (PSHE/RE) we are becoming familiar with Christian values and making connections to personal and school values. For PSHE we are looking at living in the wider world - focusing on the environment and money.

AS MUSICIANS we will be producing our final songs using our lyrics. We will do this by adding melody to the lyrics and backing in the form of keyboard, ukulele, guitar or percussion from everyday house-hold items.

## To what extent do you agree that the Earth's biomes are fragile environments?

**AS SCIENTISTS** we are going to revise what we have learnt this year in Science. How much do you remember from your topics this year?

**AS MATHEMATICIANS** we will begin the term by looking at shapes and lines of symmetry. We will then move on to position and movement before revising what we have done throughout the year.

AS DESIGNERS we will spend the first 3-4 weeks looking at Shakespearean art and designing our own Shakespearean self portraits. For the last half of the term, we will design and create our own biomes using a variety of different materials.
