Dear Parent and Carer

It was wonderful to see all our students back on site at Atlantic Academy last week and I hope that your child has enjoyed coming back to school. We want our students to feel safe coming back, and for you to feel confident as well and that you and they understand the systems we have in place are to keep our students and staff as safe as possible regarding coronavirus.

I would like to take a moment to thank each member of our school community – students, parents and carers and all colleagues – for the work that each of us has undertaken this week. It has been a week like no other but everyone is adapting quickly to the new measures and responding very positively. Our students deserve special praise for the amazing way that they have come back being ready to learn, looking smart and adapting to the new school day.

Attendance

We were really pleased that we were able to get 92% of our students into secondary last week - we would love it if we could get to 95% this week and I thank you for supporting this. We will continue to monitor the situation in and out of school and will adapt our plans over the next few weeks as we get further government guidance and feedback from students, staff and parents.

Self Isolating

While we are delighted that students have been back in school, it is critical that we remain vigilant regarding Covid 19. It is to be expected that various bugs, sniffles and sneezes will do the rounds after a protracted period out of school. Should you or your child develop any of the key symptoms associated with Covid 19, however, such as a high temperature, a new, continuous cough or a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste, you should keep your child at home, isolate as a household and book a test for them as soon as is possible. Guidance For Parents/Carers on Covid-19

The latest Government Guidance continues to state that it is very important that people with symptoms of Covid 19 or people with positive COVID-19 tests (and their household members) stay at home.

If your child, or any member of the household they live in, has any of the symptoms of Covid 19 you must not send them into school. Please telephone **01305 820262** or email atlanticoffice@atlantic-aspirations.org giving your child's name, tutor group and confirm the reason for the absence if they are away.

If a child develops symptoms of Covid 19 in school, they will be cared for in our Covid-19 isolation room. We will contact parents/carers to collect their child as soon as possible. Please ensure we have the correct details for you and you have signed the [the home school agreement form](#) to support this.

You should follow the Gov.uk guidance about what to do including arranging relevant testing. In line with the guidance, we will authorise the absence of any child with COVID-19 symptoms. Once you have received the COVID-19 test result, please inform the school immediately by telephone on **01305 820262**. If your child receives a negative test but is still feeling unwell, they should remain home until they are feeling well enough to attend.

Parents and Visitors on site

At the current time, we are not able to allow parents on site unless there is an emergency. If parents or friends and family are collecting children on foot, we kindly ask them to wait off site. However, if you wish to speak to a member of staff please use the correct contact form on our website :

- **Parents Evenings:** We will update you nearer the time on how we will deliver these.


Feedback to students

We regularly receive guidance from the Department for Education on the safety of receiving work from students, reading it, providing feedback and then giving it back. Scientific guidance seems to differ on the length of time that Covid-19 can live on various surfaces. In order that we can keep everyone safe, teachers will not be signing each page for the foreseeable future to limit contact with books. In the vast majority of cases, therefore, students' books will be kept in school between lessons. Teachers cannot take the books home. This does provide more of a challenge in marking work, especially as our staff are not staying in their own classroom this term, but instead are moving to where the students are based. During this period of time, the majority of feedback will take place in the following ways:

- Whole Class feedback: This is when the teacher reads the work of all of the students and then shares one common feedback sheet with them, highlighting the main strengths and areas for improvement.
- Verbal feedback.
- Live Feedback: This is feedback that occurs during the lesson.

Thank you for your continued support! It means a huge amount to know that you are with us as we strive to provide outstanding opportunities for all of our young people. I would like to take a final moment to wish all of our families the very best for the year ahead and to wish each of our students a successful and safe start to 2020-2021.
