## OUR DRIVING QUESTION:

## As zoologists, how do we learn about wildlife across the British Isles?

**AS WRITERS** we will be reading a beautiful poetry book about nature called 'The Lost Words.' We will be writing poems and diary entries about British wildlife.

**AS MATHEMATICIANS** we will be continuing our work with shape, moving on to 3D shapes, and then we will be learning about mass and fractions.

**AS HUMANITARIANS** we will be exploring maps of the world and the British Isles, learning about the mountains, forests and coasts and the wildlife which live there.

**AS COMPUTER SCIENTISTS** we will be analysing data and information through pictograms.

**AS ARTISTS** we will explore the architecture of the British Isles

**AS SCIENTISTS** we will be learning about animals and their habitats and also look into animal food chains.

**AS CITIZENS (PSHE/RE)** in RE, we will be learning about Hinduism and the Christian celebration of Easter. In PSHE, we will be learning about rights and responsibilities.
