OUR DRIVING QUESTION:

AS WRITERS we are exploring how persuasive text can be used to form a protest and looking at how emotive language can be used to convey a point of view.

AS COMPUTER SCIENTISTS we will be creating a program by looking at repetition in shapes.

AS CITIZENS (PSHE/RE) we are becoming familiar with the beliefs and culture of Islam as well as looking deeper into the Christian faith with the pentecost.

AS MUSICIANS we will be looking at texture in music.

To what extent do you agree that the Earth's biomes are fragile environments?

AS SCIENTISTS we will be looking at the human body and how we digest and use our food. We will look at how the different parts of the body work together to make digestion happen.

AS MATHEMATICIANS we will complete our work on decimals before moving onto measurement of mass, volume and length.
