Dear Parent/Carer and Student

Letter to children and young people from the Secretary of State

Testing and contact tracing in schools and colleges over the Easter holidays

Following the success of the asymptomatic testing programme on the return to school, it is vital to keep testing at home throughout the Easter holidays and into the Summer Term. Staff and students should:

- continue to test twice a week at home (all those who are able to)
- report positive, negative or void results using the report a COVID-19 rapid lateral flow test result portal
- test before returning to school for the summer term either the night before or the morning of the first day back to find and isolate any positive cases.

For the purposes of contact tracing, staff, students, parents and carers need only inform us of a positive case if the symptoms develop within 2 days of being in the school or they have tested positive with a lateral flow device (LFD) test (and will subsequently need to book a confirmatory PCR test). We will then identify close contacts and advise students to self-isolate, as the individual may have been infectious whilst in school.

If anyone tests positive or gets coronavirus symptoms, please report it here on our website, self-isolate immediately and get a PCR test to confirm the result.
