Dear Parents/Carers,

Carey Outdoor Education Centre Residential 20th June - 22nd June 2022

We are very excited to inform you that the Year 5 residential visit for 2022 will be to Carey Outdoor Education Centre, Wareham.

The trip includes the following:

- 3 days of activities
- 2 nights accommodation
- Activities (a selection of the activities below will be chosen as part of the visit)
- Accommodation options both under canvas & indoors
- All meals
- Transport to and from Carey Camp

Activities can include;

- Team Building Activities
- Low Ropes
- Archery
- Tree Climbing
- Orienteering
- Environmental Art
- Shelter Building
- Film Night
- Problem Solving

The trip will be run on a first come, first served basis, and the cost is likely to be approximately £130 and will need to be paid in instalments - the first being a **deposit of £30 by Monday 28th February 2022 to secure your child's place.** The final cost will depend on numbers. Please ensure that if you commit to a place for your child that you are able to make all of the payments by the required dates. The full cost of the visit must be paid by Friday 10th June 2022. All places will be based on a student's behaviour in school over the coming months before the visit.



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This is a suggested list which includes clothing to keep your child warm and dry, and be comfortable and safe for activities. Clothes should be old as they may get muddy etc.

- Sleeping bag in a strong bag, blankets, a sleeping-mat and a small pillow
- **Warm clothes and socks to sleep in e.g. track suit - very important especially in early summer**
- Wash kit and towel
- **Waterproof jacket** and overtrousers if possible. Warm jacket.
- Wellington boots are essential
- Walking boots or trainers essential
- Hat and gloves/sunhat and sun lotion
- Sweaters/sweatshirts and jeans/tracksuits/trousers/shorts
- T shirts, long sleeve shirts
- Underwear. Socks - thick and thin pairs

Also

- Small day rucksack
- Plastic bags for wet or dirty clothes
- Torch and spare batteries
- Hair band for long hair
- Reading book and small (not electronic) game
- Teddy if your child is used to sleeping with one at home

For meals

- Plate, bowl, mug, (unbreakable), knife, fork and spoon in a strong carrier bag to keep them clean and together
- Water bottle (unbreakable)
