OUR DRIVING QUESTION:

AS WRITERS we will be studying The Secret of the Night Train by Slyvia Bishop. Linked to our Destination Europe topic, our main writing focus will be persuasive writing. We will also be writing some descriptive pieces linked to destinations explored in our class text.

AS COMPUTER SCIENTISTS we will focus on e-safety and being safe on the internet.

AS MUSICIANS we will be learning and performing one of ABBA's greatest hits: Mamma Mia!

AS CITIZENS (PSHCE/RE) we will be looking at what it means to be who we are in our world and learning about the religion of Buddhism.

How can we, as tour guides, promote a trip to our chosen European destination?

AS MATHEMATICIANS we will revisit place value and the four operations to cement and build upon prior knowledge. We will move onto numbers up to 10,000 and addition and subtraction with renaming.

AS ATHLETES, we will be taking part in Invasion Games (football, netball, tag-rugby basketball,) and developing individual skill and learning teamwork within sport.

IN FRENCH we will be learning about phonetics, and presenting ourselves.

AS GEOGRAPHERS we will explore key European countries and cities described in our class text.

AS SCIENTISTS we are going to be learning about how we know if an organism is living or non-living. We will also investigate how different organisms are classified into their different groups, moving from vertebrates and invertebrates into their many sub-groups.

AS ARTISTS we will be using our knowledge of folds to create a class pop-up book about European Landmarks.
