OUR DRIVING QUESTION:

How can we, as palaeontologists, identify different dinosaurs?

IN WRITING we will continue to learn letter sounds and will be attempting to write short CVC words (cat, mat, sad) using our phonic knowledge. We will be mastering writing our names.

IN MATHEMATICS we will continue to develop our counting skills and will be looking at ordering numbers to 10, basic measurement and gaining a more in depth knowledge about numbers to 10.

IN PHONICS we will be reviewing set one sounds and working on orally blending our initial sounds.

IN UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD we will be looking at the similarities or differences between objects/dinosaurs and how things can and have changed over time.

IN EXPRESSIVE ARTS AND DESIGN we will be exploring different mediums to create a desired outcome and will be practising our Christmas production.

IN COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE we will be looking at retelling the story of 'Where the Forest meets the Sea.'
