OUR DRIVING QUESTION:

AS WRITERS we will be using our class text Treason by Berlie Doherty to inspire our writing. We will be writing a letter in role as Will, the main character from the story. We will also write a character description, diary entry, as well as writing our own story set in medieval time. We will start the half term off with some work on riddles.

AS COMPUTER SCIENTISTS we will be recapping e-safety and learning how to use technology to help with planning an event.

AS CITIZENS (PSHCE/RE) we will be looking at each religion's view of peace. In PSHCE we will be thinking about our feelings and those of others, whilst maintaining respectful friendships.

Who was the greatest Medieval Monarch?

AS HISTORIANS we will be considering the driving questions through a study of: the rightful heir to the throne in 1066, the death of Thomas Beckett, Kings Richard and John, Edward 1, the reasons for the reformation with Henry VIII and Elizabeth I.

AS ARTISTS we will be painting our tudor portrait.

AS ATHLETES we will be delving into the world of Gymnastics, mastering floor movements and shapes as well as using the apparatus in the Sports Hall.

IN FRENCH we will be work on vocabulary and phrases connected with the family.

AS MATHEMATICIANS we will be working on multiplication and division followed by fractions.

AS SCIENTISTS we are going to be studying the Earth and the Solar system. We will be looking at the different scientists who investigated what the Earth and planets looked like in the past and the types of evidence they used.
