OUR DRIVING QUESTION:

AS WRITERS we will be writing third person recounts about the Viking raids, creating a fact file about Alfred the Great and looking at our driving question: Why did the Vikings not settle on Portland?

AS COMPUTER SCIENTISTS we are continuing our work with programming, looking at repetition in games.

AS CITIZENS (PSHE/RE) we are looking at the wider world and how we fit into it. As well as looking at the importance of the Bible to Christians.

AS ARTISTS we will be practising our clay work skills as we create our very own Dragon Eye sculptures.
