KS3 Year 7, 8 and 9 – Homework timetable

Year 7, 8 and 9 homework comprises of 2 tasks each evening, totalling 60 minutes – Monday to Saturday.

Task 1 – Self Quizzing

Each evening students will self-quiz using their Subject Knowledge Organisers. Students will be directed to specific lines of their Subject Knowledge Organiser to learn that evening. Students will spend 30 minutes on this each evening, completing a minimum of 1 page of their practice book. Below shows what subject students will be self-quizzing each night.

Task 2a – Reading

Three times per week, as per above, students will have a 30 minute reading task to complete. Students should keep track of their reading via the google form available each week. Rewards and celebrations for reading will take place throughout each Unit.

Task 2b – Maths

KO style work will be checked by tutors. Additional work on either MyMaths or Maths Watch will be set Friday to Friday to cover Wednesday and Friday homework for years 7 and 8 and Monday, Wednesday and Friday homeworks for year 9. Maths online homework will be overseen by the Maths team.

Sanctions

The students' tutor will check their practice book each morning during tutor time. If task 1 is not completed, is incomplete, or completed to an unacceptable standard, the tutor will enter them for a same day detention, 30 minutes per task. Additional detentions will be set for Maths online that is incomplete.

SEND Reasonable adjustments

In order to support the cognitive load of our SEND students, the first 3 points of each weekly Knowledge Organiser Homework will be the 3 most critical to support learning in the topic. Student for whom this would be supportive will focus on these three points and this will be written into their Learning Profiles.

Years 10 and 11 – Homework timetable

Year 10 and 11 homework comprises of a mixture of Knowledge Organiser and subject tasks. Task 1 – Self Quizzing

Each evening students will self-quiz using their Subject Knowledge Organisers. Students will be directed to specific lines of their Subject Knowledge Organiser to learn that evening. Students will spend 30 minutes on this each evening, completing a minimum of 1 page of their practice book. Below shows what subject students will be self-quizzing each night. This will be checked by the students' tutor the following morning during tutor time. *Maths do not have a knowledge organiser but will be set work to support exam questions on a Monday evening and will be checked by the Maths team.

Task 2 – Notes, Exam Questions, Essays

Each week, each subject may set an additional task (with at least a 48 hour turn-around) by their subject teacher, from the selection above. It is critical to students' success that this independent work is completed and non-completion may result in further sanctions.

Sanctions for KO homework

The students' tutor will check their practice book each morning during tutor time. If task 1 is not completed, is incomplete, or completed to an unacceptable standard, the tutor will enter a negative point.

SEND Reasonable adjustments

In order to support the cognitive load of our SEND students, the first 3 points of each weekly subject Knowledge Organiser will be the 3 most critical to support learning in the topic. Students for whom this would be supportive will focus on these three points and this will be written into their Learning Profiles.
