Student Uniform and Equipment 2023 to 2024

Rationale

This Academy believes in high standards, high aspirations and the highest expectations in every aspect of its operation. Students and staff are expected to take pride in their appearance and this will support in developing high levels of self-worth and character. The Academy aims to give all students the foundations for a successful life by helping them to develop the skills and attitudes that will provide them with real life-chances. Students are expected to work hard and to achieve their individual best academically, to develop skills relevant to the 21st Century and to develop the self-confidence and sense of purpose necessary for success in a highly competitive global society.

A smart appearance is an increasingly important aspect of modern life as it does help a person to display an air of self-confidence and a sense of respect. The Academy aims to prepare students for a successful life and so an emphasis on taking pride in one's own appearance is an essential part of the educational process. The Academy has a strict uniform policy which helps to enhance the purposeful and successful climate of the Academy. Our uniform policy demands professionalism and ensures safety which also ensures that students are fully focused on learning as opposed to other distractions.

The Academy uniform provides students with many positive advantages, because uniform:

- Diminishes the social exclusion of students based on what they are wearing
- Places stronger focus on academic performance
- Reduces family tension as students do not have to compete with their peers for the latest trends in clothes
- Creates an atmosphere of teamwork
- Encourages pride in personal appearance and of the Academy
- Promotes safety, particularly through making it easier to identify strangers
- Increases self-esteem and reduces peer pressure
- Most cost effective to parents in the long run
- Makes them ambassadors for the Academy in the local community.

Students are expected to wear full Academy uniform on the way to and from the Academy. Jewelry and other forbidden items will be confiscated and only returned at the end of each half-term.

Essential items of uniform, e.g. Academy blazer, some items of PE kit, are only available from the Academy uniform suppliers, Dorset Embroidery & Printwear (DEP) Weymouth and Brigade Schoolwear, online.

- Blazer (with logo)

- Blazer (with logo)
- Tie (with faculty colour)
- Skirt
- Jumper (with logo) or plain v neck knitted jumper
- PE Polo shirt (with logo)

Academy Blazer	Grey with blue piping	DEP or Brigade
Trousers	Black, tailored, classic style and full length to the shoes NOT jean like corduroy, overly tight, leggings or shorts. If a belt is required it should be plain black with a discrete, small buckle.	Any
Shorts	Black, tailored, classic style and knee length. NOT jean like, corduroy, overly tight. Shorts can be worn from Easter term.	Any
Skirt	Skirts must be a knee length, black uniform style skirt, that can have a small split or vent in the middle, at the back. Not Acceptable: Rolled up skirts. Skirts that are bodycon or not regulation length. No visible studs, patterns, buttons, embellishment or trimmings.	Any

Jumper	Logoed top, compulsory from October ½ term to Easter. Unless communicated otherwise i.e. unseasonably warm day. Option of plain v - neck knitted jumper	DEP or Brigade
Socks	Black with trousers, white ankle socks with skirts. Plain with no logos.	Any
Tights	Plain black tights only, to be worn with a skirt from October ½ term to Easter.	Any
Shoes	A plain design, polishable plain black shoes, with traditional soles and design. No: trimmings, logos, decorative buckles, coloured laces or stitching, or other decorations, shoe/trainer hybrids, trainers, fabric shoes or boots.	Any
Coat/Jacket	Appropriate coat, not to be worn inside the Academy building. No: hoodies, fabric/knitted tops, cardigans, jumpers, sweatshirts, tracksuit tops, waistcoats, sleeveless tops, body warmers, denim or leather jackets etc.	Any
Bag	Advise these to be a plain (as possible) rucksack style, as a guide must be able to hold full A4 size folders and be waterproof. No: plastic carrier bags, shoulder pouches, fashion bags or other inappropriate bags.	Any

Further Information

Hair/Appearance

Individual fashion statements such as extreme hair-styles or non natural colours are not permitted. Only black or white hair accessories are allowed. No decorative attachments, coloured weave or extensions are to be worn in the hair. Shaved lines in the hair or eyebrows are not permitted. No makeup at all in Years 7 or 8, no visible make-up in Years 9 to 11 e.g. lip gloss, mascara, eyeliner and eyeshadow may be used sparingly. Henna decorations, nail varnish, nail decorations, French tips or extensions are not permitted. Tinted or cosmetic contact lenses and decorative dental wear are not permitted. No hoods, hats, caps or bandannas to be worn anywhere on the Academy site. Fashion spectacles are not permitted.

Jewelry/Valuables

No jewelry except for one wrist watch (no SMART watches) and a maximum of one pair of small plain, gold or silver ball (no stones) stud earrings in each ear. Nose studs, facial and body piercings or visible tattoos are not permitted. No accessories are to be worn around the neck, wrists, and ankles or attached to clothing. Large amounts of money and expensive personal effects should not be brought on site. The Academy will not accept liability for any claim arising from theft, accidental loss or damage to personal effects, money, belongings or clothing whilst on the premises.

Mobile Phones and other electronic devices

Mobile phones, computer tablets/games etc must not be switched on on site. They must be stored away in bags at all times.

Other valuables

Money should be kept in a purse or wallet securely on their person. Confiscated items are to be collected at the end of half-term or by a parent/carer.

GUIDANCE NOTES

The Uniform Policy is strict and consistently applied.

The policy encourages in students a sense of pride, belonging and loyalty to the community of which they are members. Students are expected to be smartly dressed at all times, including on their journey to and from the Academy.

Any potential inequalities and negative group allegiances are also eliminated by the Uniform Policy. When a student is not in full uniform or expected appearance, they will not be permitted to attend lessons. In such cases students will, with parental consent, be sent home to change, or alternatively undertake supervised work within the Faculty until the student is of correct appearance. If in any doubt about the details of the Uniform Policy, and to save time and anguish, please contact the Academy. It is better to check.

We will always set the highest expectations for our students in order to raise their aspirations and enable them to fulfill their true potential. Parental engagement is one of the biggest factors behind student achievement and so your ongoing support is essential in supporting your child's academic progress.

By ensuring that your child presents themselves to the Academy each morning with full equipment it shows that the student is aspiring to progress to their full potential.

By students always being fully equipped it supports the impact of every minute of every lesson being maximised.

We have a zero tolerance focus on equipment and I would like to take this opportunity to communicate to all parents about the <u>essential equipment</u> that every student, years 5 to 11, is required to have in their possession each day at Atlantic Academy from September 2020:

2 x blue or black pens
30 cm ruler (not foldable)
1 purple pen
Casio FX-85GT Plus calculator (or similar)
Pair of Compasses

2 x Highlighters

Eraser
Pencil sharpener
Reading book: age and challenge appropriate: as allocated through the Accelerated Reader Programme (ARP) or through GCSE English Literature

Students (Years 7 and above) will be withheld from attending lessons, until parents or carers deliver the missing items, if any items of equipment are not present in morning tutor time checks. There will be an opportunity to buy equipment via squid and collect from reception, from 8.00am to 8.25am each day. As well as at break and lunch – but only for replacement items that have run out during that day.
