How your child can be successful in Year 4

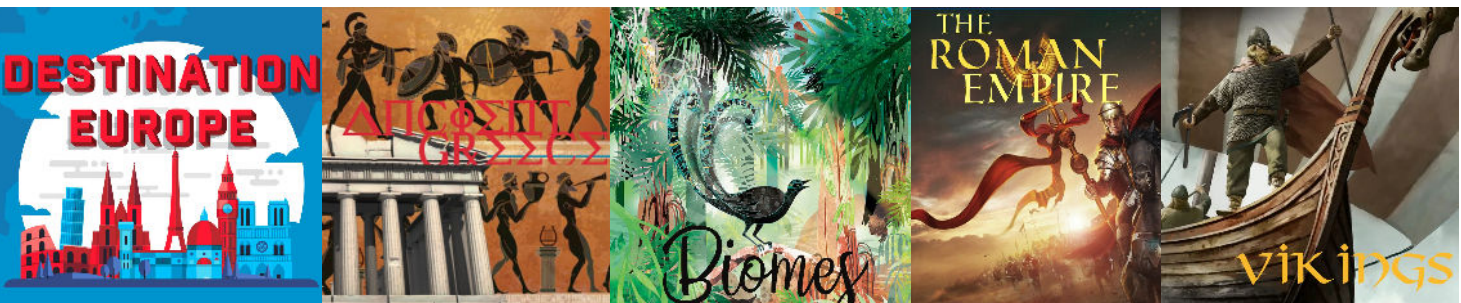
- Be on time - the school day starts at 8.27am when the gates open
